General Information

Wisconsin AHEC's CHIP enables advanced undergraduate and graduate students who have an interest in community health, public health and population health to work full time (40 hours per week) with local health departments, tribal health centers, community health centers and community service agencies throughout Wisconsin for an eight-week summer internship. Projects address a variety of public health issues and vary widely to suit interns' interests and the needs of local organizations. Past interns have engaged in program and policy development, monitoring, evaluation, research, and education to name a few. Interns gain valuable public health knowledge, skills, and experience while providing host sites with the Human Resources needed to strengthen and extend their practice in ways that might not otherwise be possible. On-site mentors provide technical support and assistance and will facilitate shadowing opportunities to help interns gain an understanding and an appreciation of the broad range of public health activities undertaken at the local level. The program would not be possible without the dedication and commitment of these community health professionals.

The 2020 CHIP program runs from Monday, June 1st through Friday, July 24th! Interns receive a stipend of \$2,400 (subject to income tax) for their full-time commitment throughout the 8-week program. We offer two program tracks: a Milwaukee program and a Statewide program. While both programs run concurrently, offer similar student experiences, and share common goals/outcomes, they are coordinated separately. The table below addresses differences in programming. You may use the same application to apply to either the Milwaukee CHIP program, the Statewide CHIP program, or both. Please note, if you wish to be considered for Milwaukee CHIP, a Milwaukee CHIP site must be your FIRST or SECOND choice.

Project matches are determined by the overall quality of the application, site rankings in the application, and essays. If accepted, you may interview with the site mentor and discuss the proposed project before your placement is confirmed.

In either case, we do our best to match students with their project interest and location preference. Highlights of recent CHIP project themes (and examples):

- **Grassroots efforts** to engage ethnically diverse, low-income community members
- **Chronic disease prevention:** community physical activity promotion campaign
- **Environmental health programs:** sampling and analysis of beaches, pools, and wells
- **Local policy and program development:** conduct community health assessments
- **Health education:** training curriculum for day care providers
- **Improving access to healthcare services:** development of a free clinic
- **Marketing and communication:** implementation of social media and videos
- **Research:** survey design, focus groups, statistical methods, literature searches

To be eligible for the CHIP program, applicants must:

- be a Wisconsin resident or student attending a college or university in Wisconsin;
- be a US citizen or permanent resident;
- *preferably* have a GPA of 3.0 or higher;
- *preferably* completed at least two years of college coursework by June 2020;
- have an interest in community, public, or population health.

This is a highly competitive program. Most internships are awarded to current juniors, seniors, or graduate students. **The full application requires:**

- 1) Completion of the online application
- 2) Unofficial Transcripts
- 3) Two letters of recommendation

The deadline for Student Applications is February 15th, 2020!

Interns will also collect water samples from required sources, incubate and interpret samples, and document and report results. Candidates are to be consumer friendly and confident of the job that Ashland County is required to perform.</p> <p>This position involves travel and outside work including ferry trips to Madeline Island, and at times scheduling their own workload. In addition, this position offers exposure to many facets of Environmental Health, including restaurant, retail, pool, festival inspections, and Human Health Hazard investigations. Internship Summary:
 Bayfield County is located in northern Wisconsin, with beautiful outdoor summer activities including hiking, kayaking, biking and fishing. On the shores of Lake Superior, we have a wide array of outdoor opportunities for summer interns when off-duty!

The Bayfield County Summer Internship Project includes a lot of outdoor, field work when on-duty as well. During the summer, Bayfield County Health Department monitors water quality of all of the public beaches along Lake Superior, from Port Wing to Washburn, Wisconsin. We like to call it the "Circle Tour" as it follows the route that is part of the larger "Circle Tour" around all of Lake Superior. This internship would involve collecting water samples from public beaches, monitoring the wildlife and recreational presence at public beaches, and running the samples in a certified Environmental Health Water Lab. The intern would be trained on how to run both surface (ex. beach) and well water samples for bacteria and be able to notify the public or owners when a sample has elevated bacteria. They would also post beaches (i.e. with signs) if the levels were elevated.... in other words, there's a lot of beach time with this internship!! Remember to bring your flip flops!!

While completing field work, this summer intern would also be involved in a small tickborne research project in partnership with Northland College. The intern would collect tick specimens (already secured in a plastic bag - not on them!!) from park trailhead sites and deliver these insect specimens to Northland College for analysis related to Lyme Disease and tickborne illness.

Another component of this internship is Public Health Outreach. Whether creating a new brochure, revising existing patient education, or developing social media posts for use on the Health Department Facebook page, this intern would help with community outreach on the various public health programs and, in the meantime, learn more about what we do in Public Health! (No previous Graphic Design experience necessary!)

Lastly, this internship presents a wide variety of opportunities for job shadowing in public and environmental health. This intern would be able to participate in home visits with pregnant or postpartum moms and their newborns, shadow inspections of tourist rooming houses, restaurants or well water collection with an Environmental Sanitarian, as well as shadow at the Women, Infants & Children Program to observe nutrition counseling with a diverse population. Job shadowing can be tailored to the intern's preference, but the opportunities abound in Bayfield County. Come see why we love to work, live and play in Bayfield County!

Skills and Experience Needed: Required -- Ability to drive a vehicle, ability to communicate via telephone, finger dexterity sufficient to type, drive and complete laboratory analysis. Preferred -- Sociable, "go-getter", interested in learning about the environment around them, self-driven and self-motivated

Important Considerations: Ability to find housing - prior to start. There are fewer rental properties or large apartment complexes in the area - but a lot of campgrounds. If you think outside of the box, you might find the solution! Ability to have access to a car - even when off-duty. We have county vehicles for use during the internship, but occasionally all county cars might be in use. The other consideration is whether you want to travel in your off time. Bayfield County is 100% rural - meaning it's a really big county, with not a lot of large cities. Our largest city is in Washburn, but public transportation is...well, it's hit or miss. Mostly miss. Very seldom do we ask an intern to work additional hours or over hours. Every now and again, we might ask that they flex their day to be able to read samples later in the day or attend a training. If interested in working the full summer (i.e. June - end of August), that's a real possibility. If the intern likes it here, and wants to stay longer, we most likely would offer them a part-time position until Labor Day if they are up for it!! Must be comfortable driving - it's really a very scenic drive, but this position would require a few hours of driving, at least twice a week. Ability to work outside the office... in sand (i.e. uneven surface). In hot weather, cold weather, and occasionally rain (and.. hopefully not snow!). The water in Lake Superior is a bit colder in June, and so water sampling can be a bit brisk. Something to consider (waders are a really great solution, though!).

Internship Summary:

The primary project goal is to decrease childhood lead poisoning. The activities to achieve this goal will be identifying pre 1950 homes, providing education to landlords, renters, contractors, and other key community partners about the dangers of lead and ways to decrease exposure. The student will research policies to decrease childhood lead poisoning and educate key leaders such as the Health and Human Services and Veterans committee. Other activities may include identifying community resources, an educational campaign and consulting with other agencies.

The secondary project will be to assist in a project to monitor ground water quality in Buffalo County. Activities will include visiting to private residences and collect water samples for a county wide water testing program. The collected water samples will be sent and analyzed for total coliform bacteria, nitrate, pH, alkalinity, total hardness, chloride, conductivity, corrosivity, and diaminochlorotriazine (DATC) screen (for herbicides). Sampling would take place in a grid sampling effort at 1 sample per 2 mile x 2 mile section in Buffalo County. Education will be provided to the community based on the results.

Important Considerations: Must have a valid driver's license. This project will take them driving to private residences to collect water samples and speak with individuals. There will also be potential public speaking opportunities.

Internship Summary:
Clark County is seeking an eager individual who is interested in advancing their health education/promotion skills. Clark County Health Department (CCHD) is a very passionate and progressive department, whom is working towards re-branding and increasing education and outreach efforts via a variety of methods.

You will have the opportunity to develop marketing materials and help re-brand the Clark County Health Department. This will be accomplished by updating and/or developing new health communication tools including brochures, active displays, bulletin boards, infographics, banners, social media/website content, Amish-Mennonite newsletter columns, elderly newsletter information, newspaper press releases, and radio public service announcements. Internship Summary:

Client satisfaction is an important measure of both quality and outcomes of services provided. Historically, Public Health Madison & Dane County (PHMDC) has not assessed client satisfaction with Community Health Division services, focusing instead on quantitative data and regulations in structuring service delivery. Moving forward, PHMDC is intentionally working to prioritize community voice in order to shift power and improve quality of care. PHMDC is looking to transform service delivery in the tuberculosis (TB) and immunizations programs based on client input.

This project aims to create a plan to systematically collect and implement client feedback. The internship will increase the capacity for PHMDC to understand current practices and policies that are not client-centered and develop recommendations for changes to implement as needed. Additionally, client engagement expands beyond the TB and Immunizations Programs; results of this work will inform PHMDC agency-wide.

Skills and Experience Needed: Required -- 1) Communication skills: written, oral and electronic communication; comfort with interpersonal communication; 2) Organization: time management skills, working independently and with a team; 3) Ability to conduct research and summarize findings of evidence-based practices around client engagement in service delivery; 4) Understanding of data collection and analysis. Preferred -- Ability to demonstrate cultural humility and practice self-reflection

Important Considerations: The PHMDC office is in Madison on the bus line. Work hours will be Monday-Friday from 8:00am-4:30pm. Occasional opportunities may occur outside of the regular work hours. The intern will primarily spend their time in an office setting with some local travel for meetings and other activities. <p>Internship Summary: Public Health Madison & Dane County (PHMDC) is enrolled in the FDA Voluntary National Retail Food Regulatory Program Standards. These Standards are designed to help achieve national uniformity among regulatory food programs for eliminating the occurrence of foodborne illnesses and deaths from restaurant and retail food facilities. In June of 2019, Washburn County Unit on Aging was awarded a grant for Expanding the Mind Via Virtual Reality with Seniors in Washburn County. This grant, awarded the amount of \$15,000, was supported by the Helen Daniels Bader Fund, a Bader Philanthropy. These funds were used to purchase six sets of Virtual Reality Goggles, equipment and support through Rendever. (<https://rendever.com/>) (<https://www.facebook.com/rendever/>)

In 2015, a group of MIT grad students and technology entrepreneurs launched a company called Rendever for adults in assisted living facilities and seniors suffering from social isolation and depression. They started testing this equipment in the Boston area, and it is now being used throughout the country. VR (Virtual Reality) provides the ability for seniors to socially interact with each other and experience destinations and opportunities that they would otherwise not be able to attain. It is also being used for numerous other applications such as pain management and brain stimulation for those affected by dementia.

Bader Philanthropies recognized the valuable opportunity that this equipment could provide to the rural, isolated older adults in Northern, Wisconsin and we are honored that they chose to support this project in Washburn County. Our goal is to utilize the equipment throughout the county, in our senior centers, with the homebound and in partnership with other agencies that support older adults and their caregivers.

Now that the equipment is up and running, we would like to incorporate interns to facilitate the VR experience. Part of the grant also covered the purchase of a 3D GoPro Camera, which staff have not had the time to use. Our hope is that we could find a Tech savvy, outgoing, intern who could also assist with creating 3D videos of Washburn County.

Summer recreation provides additional challenges for public safety. **How Milwaukee County Policy Perpetuates Racially Disparate  
Outcomes**

**Internship Summary:**

Since the County Executive's declaration of racism as a public health crisis, the county has expanded its effort to provide racial equity training to leadership (25.5 hours), managers (11 hours), and staff (3.5 hours) to help normalize conversations about racial equity. The trainings highlighted a few historical and current Milwaukee County policies and practices that have contributed to Milwaukee's status as one of the most segregated



Metropolitan Statistical Areas in the country. We recognize that our institution sits in this context of racism, but we do not fully understand the specific role our institution has played in perpetuating racial inequities, either through passive tolerance or active discrimination. We would like a UniverCity year team to help us understand the history of racism specifically inside of our institution so we can work to overcome structures and systems that have been designed to promote and perpetuate inequity among employees and the residents we serve. Questions to be answered: - What role did the county play through policy and practice to perpetuate disparate outcomes for African-Americans? - Could there be a subset of policy recommendations that never became law that we could highlight to help us move beyond these racist policies? - What's the role of the county government structure in perpetuating the lack of power that African-Americans have in the political process?

Students will conduct extensive legislative research, conduct interviews with key informants (policy and historical experts), and synthesize their findings into a timeline showcasing the trajectory of how policy ideas translate into realities for different racial groups. Students will work with relevant community groups (e.g. Black Holocaust Museum) and policy bodies (e.g. Milwaukee County Human Rights Commission) as necessary.

**Internship Summary:**  
 The intern will function as an adult advisor and mentor to 7th-12th grade students charged with implementing youth-led tobacco prevention and educational outreach. The intern will be responsible for working with approximately 15 -20 youth over the summer. They will support the youth in implementing two programs: FACT which is Wisconsin youth-led tobacco prevention program, funded by DHS, and WI Wins which is a Wisconsin program, managed by the American Lung Association that is designed to restrict youth access to tobacco products and managed by the American Lung Association. Typical assignment includes supporting youth in “spreading the truth about tobacco” which might involve tabling at community fairs, back-to-school events and festivals or engaging in some other type of peer-to-peer education. Media advocacy also happens from time to time and might involve radio or television interviews, writing letters to the editors and preparing photo captions for submission to the local media. The second program is the WI WINS program that involves youth partnering with the City of Milwaukee Police Department to engage in compliance checks where they, as minors they attempt to purchase tobacco products and if successful a police officer that has been assigned to them will issue a ticket. It may also involve chaperoning youth to municipal court to testify against a retailer that has sold tobacco products to them. WI Wins is managed by the City of Milwaukee Tobacco Free Alliance. This group’s summer project will focus on developing a video short that highlights the marketing the tobacco industry in their community.

**Internship Summary:**  
 Environmental health practice encompasses many aspects of public health, including housing, food services/supply, recreation, natural resource management and the reduction of hazards within our community. Sampling and testing of prepared foods is one of the most important ways to prevent foodborne illness. While food spoilage or contamination is well recognized, many may not associate the potential for disease transmission with frozen products such as dairy desserts and ice. However, documented foodborne illnesses have resulted from improper storage, maintenance and safe handling of these products. The intern assigned to this project will work closely with a registered sanitarian to collect soft serve ice cream and ice samples for testing at the Racine Health Department Laboratory, issuing subsequent orders should they fail to meet state standards. Interns will also have the opportunity to job shadow and observe other important aspects of environmental health, as well participate in our storm drain placarding program (a public education/information effort to improve surface water quality). This internship will allow the participant to enhance their: organizational/time management skills and computer data entry/database management skills. Interns will gain an appreciation for environmental aspects of public health.
